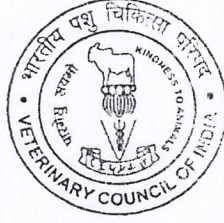

This has reference to the Notification/advertisement issued from time to time by the Central Government Organization like UPSC, BSF, RVC, ITBP, SSB etc. inviting applications from the eligible candidates for the recruitment of Veterinary officers in these organizations. These organizations laid down one of the essential requirement/criteria for making application is that the candidate should be registered with Veterinary Council of India.

As you are kindly aware that Veterinary Council of India and State Veterinary Council has been established under the provisions of Indian Veterinary Council Act, 1984. Further, the provisions of the IVC Act has been extended in all the States and Union Territory across the country. Registration under the provisions of the IVC Act is granted by the State Veterinary Council or by this Council to only those persons who possess recognised veterinary qualification. Hence, person registered with the State Veterinary Council is equally eligible to practice in Veterinary Medicine or to hold post in the Government organization as a Veterinary Physician or surgeon in view of provisions of Section 30 (a) and (b) of the IVC Act.

You will appreciate that the condition imposed by these organizationsto this effect that registration with Veterinary Council of India creates not only unnecessary pain amongst the desirous candidates but also last hour rush with Veterinary Council of India for getting registration. Further, Section 2(g) of the IVC Act provides that registered veterinary practitioner means a person whose name is for the time being duly registered in a Register and Section 2(f) of the said Act prescribed that register means a register maintain under Act.

It is relevant to mention here that State Veterinary Council maintains State Veterinary Register under this Act and VCI maintains Indian Veterinary Practitioners Register (IVPR). Further, IVPR are prepared on the basis of State Veterinary Register as per Section 23 of the IVC Act.

Hence, I would request you to kindly look into the matter personally and issue necessary advisory to the Central Government Organization like BSF, RVC, ITBP, SSB etc. to this effect that Registration under the provisions of the Indian Veterinary Council Act, 1984 may be imposed as one the main condition instead of registration with Veterinary Council of Indiafor Veterinary posts where BVSc&AH is one of the essential qualification.
